Seasons

Located in the southeast region of Saskatchewan, Regina is known for clear and sunny days under wide-open skies. Regina records an average of 2,318 sunshine hours each year. Summer is typically warm and dry with long, sunny days. Summer nights are usually cool and comfortable. Winters in Regina typically last from November to March and winter days tend to be cold, short and sunny.
