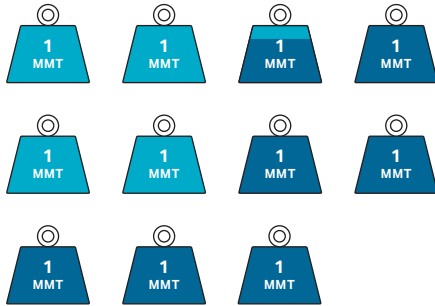


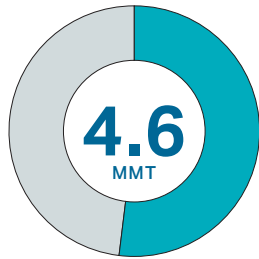
Regina's Canola Opportunity



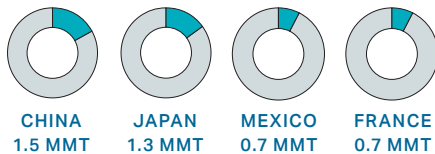

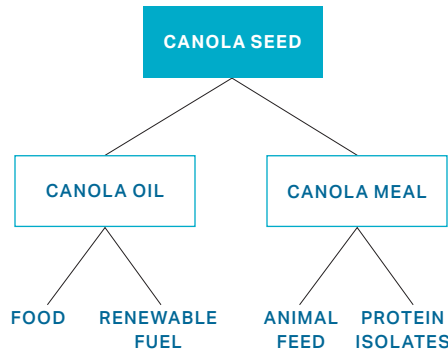


REGINA WILL PROVIDE THE LARGEST SINGLE MARKET FOR CANOLA SEED SALES*

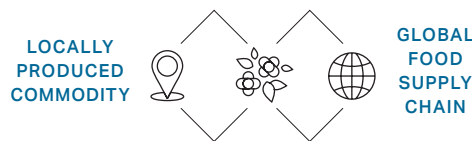
The value of value-added: Whether it's farm to table or farm to fuel tank, creating new value means new jobs for Regina area residents and new opportunities for Regina area businesses.

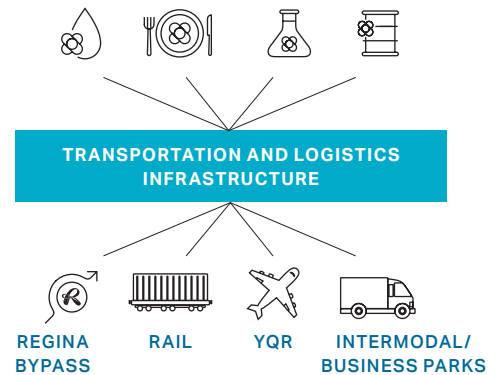
